Greetings Parents/Guardians,

We had our first round of STAAR Testing at the end of April. Our great 4th grade students took their writing test. Thank everyone so much for your support getting our kiddos . They did great. We should be getting results in late July. Our next round will be on May 12th and May 13th. This will be for fifth grade science. Then our last round will be Math and Reading for third, fourth and fifth graders. These dates are May 17th & May 18th Math and May 19th & May 20th Reading. One reminder for our testing kids, please make sure they bring their chromebook to the campus on testing day. This is for our face to face kiddos and our remote learners. All state testing is on line and students need their chromebooks.

So what will next year look like? This is my most common question so I thought I would address it here. The short version is, we don't know yet. A lot will depend on what Austin Public Health provides to us. I know President Biden has set a goal of 70% of American adults by July 4th and the intent of this is for the Americans to reach a "herd immunity" which means that there is an immunity within a high proportion of the population. I am not advocating for or against the shot, rather I am stating these are the goals that have been set. As we move along through this process then our year will start to present itself. My hope is that we can have open classrooms and kids on the campus and open to parents for morning drop off and lunch visits. I look forward to seeing everyone again. Fingers crossed we get to that level. I will keep you posted as we learn more about next year. As of now, it is too early to call.
