Dear Parent/Guardian:

On April 8, Pflugerville will be in the path of totality for a solar eclipse. This is an exciting and special event that our students have the opportunity to experience.

Keeping students safe is our number one priority. Students will receive instruction on eye safety, including how to properly wear provided eclipse glasses, and instruction to not look directly at the Sun before and after totality. During totality, which lasts about 2 minutes, it is safe for students to look at the Sun's corona without protective eyewear. Our campus has chosen to allow students to view the Sun during totality without glasses. Our teachers will review expectations and procedures with students so that everyone is prepared to view the eclipse safely. Totality can be experienced without looking at the Sun directly. Students will feel the temperature drop, hear nighttime bugs chirping, and see how dark it becomes.
